
Islam and Christianity in Bible Prophecy by Tim Roosenberg

Belize Mission Project

We are hoping to go to Belize and Rhaburn Ridge, again in March 2013. They are needing to raise \$1,500 for 2 one day church buildings \$2,500 for a one day school. These "one day" buildings will all be part of a new school. Our involvement will be the "several days" it takes to finish these "one day" buildings. Here is a short story of the mission at this location.

It was the summer of 2005, when the "Pine Ridge Singers" singing group under the leadership of women's ministry director Emily Moralez, and her husband elder Alberto Moralez felt impressed to accept the call and take the advent message for the first time to the community of Rhaburn Ridge. This village is situated alongside the Northern Highway just 13 miles out of Orange Walk Town with a population of 150 inhabitants.

The mission group was comprised of elder Moralez's wife, Emily and her sisters and brothers along with their late mother Mary Westby, who was the inspiration behind the group with her tireless and dedicated years of mission

work in opening new churches in neighboring communities.

With the blend of harmonious voices and a couple guitars, the group went door to door as they shared the gospel message through inspirational messages in songs and praying with the families. This opened the doors for several bible studies under her leadership. While visiting the many homes it was impressive to see the welcoming smiles of children that met them. After several weeks of bible studies, the group organized an evangelistic crusade that was conducted by elder Moralez after which 12 precious souls gave their heart to the Lord and became part of the group. They began the fund raising with much faith and prayers as a temporary make-shift shed was then erected and used for worship. The work moved forward as they began meeting in family homes on worship days and it was then that they decided to seek a permanent place to worship.

Soon after they were able to secure a piece of property which was later purchased thanks to the donation of a

couple from the church. As an answer to their prayers, a missionary couple from the USA, Doug and Barb Rebok, contacted them and assisted with funding for the new church building. Praise the Lord for answered prayers!!!

We are ever so grateful to the Rebok couple for their great support in this project. With a permanent place to worship now, more Bible studies continued as new members were added. The work moved forward as they began meeting in family homes on worship days, and it was then that they decided to seek a permanent place to worship.

On September 3, 2011 the little church that began with 12 members was officially named and dedicated "Pine Hill SDA church" by the union president Pastor Dennis Slusher, with 65 baptized members and 10 visitors. **PRAISE THE LORD!**

So a new challenge that is faced by the church is providing quality Christian education to the 75 children of that community. Therefore the church board met and voted to establish a school board to oversee

the school building project. Consultations were made with government officials who have granted the church 20 acres of property, adjacent to the church, for the new school. Thank God for blessings!

If you would like more information or to participate personally or financially with this project, contact Lynden or Margie Kruse!

PS. The government is so impressed with this project and the plans for it to become the only self supporting school in the country that they have withdrawn the offer of 20 acres of land and now increased it to 60 acres. Praise the Lord. We will most likely make at least 2 or 3 trips to Belize to complete this project and invite your prayers, financial support & even for some of you to join us in the work there.
