Finance Report from the Church Treasurer

The Pastor Search committee has completed their work and our new pastor Thomas Bentley and his family should arrive in Roseburg in May. Our Roseburg church leaders have provided spiritual and cohesive direction for our church family during the search process. This transition does also require from our congregation an extra effort to help provide for the needs of the church.

To begin our review of first six months of our 2012/2013 budget year, the monthly budget goal was \$13,237. For the last six months offerings received were;

October: \$10,379,

November: \$14,275 December: \$22,262 January: \$7,486 February: \$10,363 March: \$15,178.

The total offerings for the local budget exceed the total budget by \$701.

Donations to the local budget when compared to the first six months a year ago have decreased by 2.8%. The total tithe for this same time period has decreased by 9.8%.

So as it stands, as of March 31, 2013, you are able to surmise by the above numbers, the monthly donations for the local budget do

greatly swing up and down. It is recognized that each family's timing of returning their monthly tithes and offerings does reflect the monthly totals which I am reporting. The good news is that we have no deficits at this time. As a result our new Pastor will be arriving with no deficit to deal with. Thank you for your faithful support of the local church needs. The church needs consistent monthly support of all members to provide the means to pay the church bills for our ministry to the Roseburg Church

Recipe...

Pan Roasted Carrots with Barley Risotto

2 Tbsp. Grape Seed Oil

4-5 Carrots*, peeled and sliced in half lengthwise and cut into thirds (chunks)

3 Tbsp. Olive Oil

2 sprigs of fresh Thyme or 1 tsp. dried thyme

2 cloves garlic, peeled and quartered lengthwise

2 cups vegetable broth, reserve 1/2 cup of the broth

1 Tbsp. Bragg Liquid Aminos

1½ cups barley

3 heaping Tbsp. Nutritional yeast

Sea salt

Put 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups vegetable broth and the Bragg aminos in a saucepan with 4 cups water and bring to a boil. Add the barley and cook for 45-50 minutes, stirring often, until the barley is soft but not breaking up.

While barley is cooking heat the grape seed oil in a sauté pan on med. Heat. **Add the carrots and cook for 8- 10 min. or until carrots are caramelized, making sure to turn the carrots often so they are browned well on all sides. Add the 2 Tbsp. olive oil, thyme, garlic, and the reserved ½ cup of vegetable broth to the pan. Season with salt. Cover the pan with tight fitting lid and cook over medium

heat for 15 – 20 min. Then take off of heat.

After the barley has finished cooking you may find there is still a lot of liquid. Pour it off and save it.

Stir into the barley the nutritional yeast and mix well. It will be creamy. Put the cooked carrot mixture on top of the barley and serve.

The extra liquid from the cooked barley is good to use when reheating any leftover barley as the barley may get sticky after being in the refrigerator or after it has cooled for a time.

*Can use baby carrots

**Can roast carrots under the broiler instead of pan caramelizing.

Variation:

The cooked carrots could be put over a bed of couscous or left to cool and tossed in a salad with beets and toasted pine nuts.
