## Knowing Jesus Bible Study Guide #9 FAITH

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In this lesson we will conclude the first part of the Knowing Jesus series by talking about the topic of faith. Faith and grace are topics that often are confused and misunderstood. Last time we learned that grace has three characteristics; 1.) Grace is a gift of God, 2.) Grace saves you, 3.) Grace revives you. All three of these characteristics are what God does for you in Christ Jesus. Therefore grace really is Jesus both before and after you became a Christian. Faith is different as we shall see.

1.	Where does faith come from?		
	ANSWER: Romans 12:1-3 gives a measure of faith to everyone.		
	Note: The faith mentioned here is in the context of submitting your life to God out of the world and the thoughts of worldly people. Faith is what propels us in every area of life.		
2.	How can you increase your faith?		
	ANSWER: Romans 10:17 - Faith increases as we hear God's		
	Note: faith is never based upon feelings but upon the truth found in God's word.		
3.	Is faith something a Christian can be without?		
	ANSWER: Hebrews 11:6 YES NO		
4.	What is faith?		
	ANSWER: Hebrews 11:1 - Faith is		
	Note: Bible commentator E. G. White wrote: "Living faith in the Redeemer will smooth the sea of life." "Faith is the spiritual hand that touches infinity." Imagine that someone holds a chair for you to sit in. What is required for you to allow this? As we saw in question 3, God desires that we have faith that He has our best interest at heart and they He will reward us. Notice the two parts to fait in Hebrews 11:1		
	A.) Faith is assurance in what you to happen.		
	B.) Faith is in your life of something you expect that is not proven at the moment.		

In our example having faith means that your are completely sure that the chair someone is holding for you will be there if you decide to sit and the evidence of faith is seen when you actually move to sit in it.

	Note: Faith is much more than simply believing something to be true. Faith for it to be real requires action. This is the situation where you believe I will hold the chair for you but you refuse to sit.		
6.	What is it that seems to erode our faith?		
	ANSWER: James 1:1-8 Our		
	Note: it is true. Life events that don't go the way we had hoped or are troubling tend to erode our trust in God. The suggestion James gives to our problems is not to shrink in faith but to ask for wisdom to deal with them and not to waiver in the asking.		
7.	Who does Paul tell us is our example of someone who had saving faith?		
	ANSWER: Romans 4:16 The faith of		
	Note: for Paul this is the essence of faith, to trust wholeheartedly in the promise of God. To trust so much that you would leave everything you knew to follow where God would lead you.		
8.	What is the result of faith?		
	ANSWER Romans 5:1: our		
	READ Romans 4 again. Notice that in chapter 4 of Romans Paul uses the life of Abraham as our example of a life of faith. What did Abraham's faith cause him to do? Paul is clear that Abraham was justified not by what he did but by believing God's promises and acting on them. Paul would never have said that Abraham was justified by faith if he heard God's promises but decided to stay in his hometown and not leave for the promised land.

	ANSWER: Luke 17:5-6 - Move
