

"Which Bible is Right for You.?" By Pastor Thomas Bentley

As a Seventh-day Adventist Christian you are fortunate to be among a group that still holds to the Protestant belief of Sola Scriptura, that our beliefs and practices must be determined by "by Scripture alone." Even the way that we interpret the Bible has been determined by the way the Bible writers interpreted it themselves. For example: Among these are the following. First, regarding the Origin of Scripture, "The Scriptures are an indivisible union of human and divine elements, neither of which should be emphasized to the neglect of the other." Second, "The Bible is its own best interpreter and when studied as a whole it depicts a consistent, harmonious truth." Third, "Although it was given to those who lived in an ancient Near Eastern/ Mediterranean context, the Bible transcends its cultural backgrounds to serve as God's Word for all cultural, racial, and situational contexts in all ages." (Wahlen, BRI, April 2015)

With this in mind, selection of a Bible translation becomes important for those who wish to conduct serious study of the text. As you are aware there are many types of Bible translations out there, and some are better for serious study while others for use perhaps in devotional time. Bible translations fall into

three basic types. The first is called "Formal equivalence." Formal equivalent versions are quite literal and attempt to preserve word order, sentence structure, and grammar of the original language. Furthermore, the translator tries to translate a term always with the same word in the document. If words are added, they are normally shown in italics. A formal equivalence approach is basically a word-for-word translation theory. (Mueller, BRI, April 2015) Because a word-for word, translation will sometimes seem hard to understand in certain places, Bible translators attempt to bridge the gap with a translation style called "Dynamic equivalence." In this style the translator will try to create a thought-for thought instead of using the literal words found in the Greek original. This can make the reading easier, however, the translator must be more careful since they will may use a verb instead of a noun, or change the entire passage to make it more readable to the modern reader. Finally, there is the paraphrase. A paraphrase, can be like the dynamic equivalence method, but only more so. Instead of changing a few words, a paraphrase attempts to reflect the meaning of the text with entirely new words.

You might ask, "Pastor, which one would you choose?" In my experience I have tended to choose Bibles where the translators used formal equivalence. These types include the New American Standard Bible, (NASB), the English Standard Version, (ESV), the New King James Bible, (NKJV). Sometimes, in devotional time I have read from Bibles where dynamic equivalence is used such as the New Revised Standard Version, (NRSV), or the New International Version, (NIV), and the New American Bible, (NAB). If you are someone brand new to the faith, these might be good choices, but I know that formal equivalence will also help you.

Finally in the paraphrase translations we have the New Living Bible, The Message, the Good News Bible, and the Clear Word Bible. I have read some of these occasionally as devotional choices or just to see how they translate a passage from my formal equivalence Bibles. guess you might say that my choice is to have a selection, rely on the formal equivalence, and then season with the other types of translation categories. pray this helps in your study of God's amazing testimony to humanity.


